Victoria Marie Bee is an MFA Candidate specializing in photography and letterpress with an expected graduation date of December 2016 from Texas Tech University. Bee previously earned an MAE also from Texas Tech. She is currently focused on her work, developing career, collaborations with other artists and writers, and teaching. Bee was most recently selected for the juried exhibition *RED*, at SE Center for Photography in South Carolina; the juried exhibition *Still Life: The Ordinary Made Extraordinary*; and Hamilton Wood Type & Printing Museum's *New Impressions: An International Exhibition of Letterpress Printing* in Two Rivers, Wisconsin and Brisbane and Armadale, Australia. Bee exhibits and is published locally, stateside, nationally, and internationally. Bee will move in to CASP Live/Work Studio #4 in January 2017.

Rachel Anderson earned an associates degree in Fashion Design from Fashion Institute of Technology, New York City; a Bachelor of Science in Apparel Design and Manufacturing from Texas Tech University; and an MFA from the Academy of Art University, San Francisco. She is also an assistant professor at Texas Tech University teaching apparel design and manufacturing. Anderson's creative focus is tambour beading; creative 3-D design development; innovative pattern making techniques and drafts; and collaboration with educators, artists, and designers. Anderson will move into Live/Work Studio #3 in June 2017.
