March 24 – 25, 2017

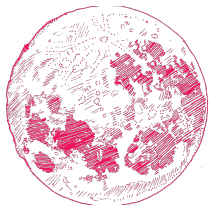
LUBBOCK, TX – Charles Adams Studio Project (CASP) is pleased to present the *High Plains Print + Music Festival*, a two-day cultural event featuring musicians and printmakers from across the state of Texas. The event will take place on Friday, March 24 and Saturday, March 25, 2017 from 6PM to 10PM on the Louise Hopkins Underwood Center for the Arts (LHUCA) Plaza, located at 511 Ave. K in downtown Lubbock, TX. Admission \$10.00 for one day, \$15.00 for both days, and youth aged 12 and under are admitted free of charge.

Inspired by the openness of the West Texas landscape and the ever-evolving artistic tradition of the region, the *High Plains Print+Music Festival* is the first of its kind in Lubbock, TX. Featuring the work of contemporary printmakers and musicians from across the state, the festival aims to showcase the diversity, innovation, and quality of printed and sonic works by Texas-based artists.

The *High Plains Print+Music Festival* includes live performances by musicians from Denton, San Antonio, Houston, and Lubbock, TX on both Friday and Saturday, with a unique lineup each night, as well as the curated exhibition *Print Waves*, featuring a digital gallery, fine art prints, and artist-designed printed posters, tshirts, magazines, and books. Visitors can also enjoy the food and drink offerings of local food trucks and vendors that will set up on site. Visitors are also encouraged to check out the print exhibitions, workshops, and artist lectures occurring as part of the *Beyond Printmaking 5 Symposium*, presented at LHUCA and CASP by the Texas Tech School of Art.
